As the BioBOND project moves towards its final stage, we are pleased to share the main results, achievements and next steps of BioBOND - Bonding Cities for a Bio-Driven and Sustainable Urban Future.

Implemented under the Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values (CERV) Programme, within the framework of the Town Twinning action, BioBOND brought together European communities to exchange ideas, strengthen cooperation and explore practical ways to support greener, more inclusive and more resilient urban spaces.

What BioBOND Achieved

Throughout the project, partners and participants explored how European towns can respond to common environmental and social challenges through cooperation, civic engagement and sustainable local action.



The project contributed to:

- stronger cooperation between municipalities and local communities
- exchange of good practices on sustainable urban development
- increased awareness of European environmental priorities
- promotion of greener and more accessible public spaces
- stronger focus on inclusive participation in local decision-making



From European Priorities to Local Action

A key achievement of BioBOND was the connection between European policy frameworks and local realities. Participants discussed how priorities such as the European Green Deal, the New European Bauhaus, the Biodiversity Strategy, the Circular Economy Action Plan and the EU Climate Pact can inspire practical initiatives at the local level.

Through discussions, presentations and exchange of experiences, BioBOND encouraged communities to reflect on how sustainability can be integrated into urban planning, public spaces and everyday civic life.

Building Long-Term Cooperation

Beyond the project activities, BioBOND created opportunities for continued collaboration among the participating communities. The Town Twinning approach helped strengthen mutual understanding, European identity and cross-border cooperation between partners from Greece, Italy, Poland, Bulgaria and Serbia.

The project also highlighted the importance of involving citizens, young people, women and underrepresented groups in discussions related to environmental action and urban transformation.



Continuing the BioBOND Legacy

Although BioBOND is reaching its final stage, the knowledge, connections and ideas developed throughout the project can continue to inspire future local action. The practices and discussions shared among the participating communities can support further reflection on climate adaptation, biodiversity protection, inclusive governance and greener public spaces.

By strengthening cooperation between towns and encouraging dialogue between local authorities, civil society organisations and citizens, BioBOND contributed to a broader understanding of sustainability as a shared European responsibility.
